With Personal Space being so hard to find in Japan the Concept of Privacy is more of State of Mind than a Condition of Being Alone. The Japanese are very good at shutting out the World around them and making their Own Privacy by losing themselves in reading a Comic Book or sleeping while they are surrounded by People....

Japanese Housewives have Traditionally Controlled the Family's Finances. They are Careful Shoppers and like Things Fresh. They look out for Bargains like everyone else but don't go in for buying things in Large Quantities like Americans, partly because they don't have Room in their Relatively Small Houses for a lot of Stuff. Women are also some of Japan's Most Active Investors... A Traditional Meal is served with Rice, Vegetables and Miso (Fermented Soy Bean Paste) Soup and Fruit is often eaten as Desert. Many Dishes come with Soy Sauce or Wasabi (Very Hot Mustard-Like Green Horseradish). Many Urban Japanese have adopted the American Way of Eating : a Big Breakfast, Light Lunch, and a Big Dinner. Miso Soup and Rice are a Dietary Base, often eaten for Breakfast, Lunch, and Dinner....

Régis Debray is a French Philosopher, Journalist, Former Government Official and Academic. He is known for his Theorization of Mediology (a Critical Theory of the Long-Term Transmission of Cultural Meaning in Human Society) and for associating with Marxist Revolutionary Che Guevara in Bolivia during 1967 and advancing Salvador Allende's Presidency in Chile in the Early 1970s. He returned to France during 1973 and later had Several Official Jobs with the French Government.
