"Searching" parcels out Clues so discretely we hardly recognize them as such. The Film reflects on the Biggest Irony of our Lives: Loneliness and Human Disconnect in Times of Online Connectivity. This Innovative Storytelling Technique makes you a part of David's Search Operation instead of being a mere Spectator. Every Call missed, Key pressed or Text read, brings a Lump in your Throat, almost mirroring our Reliance on Technology in our Daily Lives....
